Roman Zeller

Former prisoners had compiled a list of the children's names which was published in the book *Rapport fra* Neuengamme (Report from Neuengamme) in Denmark in 1945. The list also includes the name Zeller for a twelve year-old boy from Poland. On his stat sheet for this boy, Dr Heißmeyer noted the initials "R. Z.". The child's first name was probably Roman. Roman Zeller was murdered here on Bullenhuser Damm on 20 April 1945 along with the other children.

No more information about this boy was available at the time of writing.

In 1995, Roman-Zeller-Platz, a square in the Hamburg district of Burgwedel, was named after him.
