Hamburg-Spaldingstraße

From October 1944 to 17 April 1945, 2,000 men were imprisoned in a satellite camp in a tobacco warehouse at Spaldingstraße 156/158. The prisoners had to do clearance work after air raids, recover bodies, defuse bombs, repair railway track systems for the Reich's railway company and build a bunker on the River Alster.
