HAMBURG			<p>All DP's have been fed by the org which was in operation when the city fell. At no time have DP's received less than 2000 calories a day.</p> <p>On MAY 15th 521 L.I.L. Gov Det requisitioned the BORG VILHJELMSSKOLEN, the former school which increased the bathing and ablution room and kitchen facilities. They were also made to furnish the rooms in a becoming manner. THIS FIRST CLASS room for some 1,500 DP's became a DP Hotel for DP's for immediate registration and was therefore assigned to give the greatest degree of luxury that could be attained.</p> <p>In order to improve the clothing and welfare amenities of the DP's the 521 L.I.L. Gov Det on order of 521 L.I.L. Gov Det set up a warehouse and stocked it. In this manner it was possible to reassemble the needy cases, and any pianos, radios, gramms and other amenities immediately are secured. The warehouse was stocked with food from stores in the trade and partly by levy on the inhabitants of HAMBURG through the medium of RED CROSS radio.</p> <p>The det through Assembly Centres directly under its control dispatched out of HAMBURG:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1 Argentine 2 Australian 1601 Belgian 1 Dulger 1006 Czechs 102 Chinese 139 Danes and 34 Suspects. 342 Dutch 5 English 26 Estonian 7000 French 30,000 P.M. 30 Dr. Hasi, 1000 SS etc.

The problem of the Poles and the Baltic peoples is a serious one and it is hoped they will have eventually have "Lebensraum".</p> <p>Frequent accusations, unfounded, come down from the Russian Authorities of maltreatment. The reports are utterly without foundation and the nationals concerned have had utmost attention paid to their feeding, housing, clothing, welfare and other amenities. A report of Maj Jobits, Danish div is attached annex A.</p> <p>France. French IG reports evacuation of French DP's in HAMBURG better and quicker than any other place in his knowledge. Attention is drawn that they are to be screened and treated as DP's.</p>

Ils débarquèrent en Suède, malades et affaiblis, et souvent encore vêtus de leur tenue de déportés. Beaucoup d'entre eux quittèrent le pays pour rentrer dans leur patrie, après avoir retrouvé, pour le moins, leur santé physique. D'autres décidèrent de rester en Suède.
